1968 COIN EX

The Regina Coin Club invites competitive displays of numismatic material for our 1968 Coin Ex Show and Bourse at the Vagabond Motor Hotel, Albert St. South, Regina, Sask., Oct. 19th & 20th.

This year prizes will again be awarded on the Points System. Highest total points receiving "Best of Show". The next six (6) winners in order of points awarded (regardless of category) will receive "Outstanding Awards". The following six (6) winners in descending order of points awarded will receive "Excellence Awards". The next six (6) will receive "Meritorious Awards". Selection of winners in this way assures that prizes will be given to the most deserving entrant, and not restricted to the limited number in each former "category".

There will also be a 1st. for Junior Display for those eighteen and under.

Cases and locks are the responsibility of the entrant. If necessary the number of cases submitted by one entrant, and allocation of display space may be regulated at the discretion of the display committee. Suitable security will be provided at all times during the show period as well as the following morning. The Regina Coin Club and / or its executive members assume no responsibility of loss or damage to material and collections. There will be security the night before the show for those wishing to make use of same.

Entrants shall register displays with the display chairman prior to 1 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 19th, and to qualify for prizes must agree not to remove their displays from competition prior to 6 p.m. Sunday, October 20th.

Prizes will be awarded on the following points and judging system;

Information	35 points
Originality & Eye Appeal	25 points
Neatness	20 points
Condition & Rarity	15 points
Completeness	5 points

Three judges will judge only one of the five categories, so that a total of fifteen judges will be used. This will eliminate any possibility of any one judge influencing the ultimate winners.

The draw for the door prizes will be made Sunday evening, Oct. 20th.
