CONTINUING CLUB PROJECT

The executive would like to propose that the club begin to gather together a permanent collection of Saskatchewan Numismatic Material and related historical information for displaying initially for short periods in various business establishments and perhaps permanently in one of the proposed University Buildings.

A display such as this would give our club continuous advertisement throughout the year.

How do we propose to gather this material? Initially we would ask that the members donate (Sask. Medals, Tokens or what have you). It is proposed that credit would be given in the display for any donations.

Once on display we could possibly include a short note such as "If anyone has or knows of any Sask. tokens, metals, etc. not shown in the display please get in touch with the club." This might help us turn up new material.

We will, of course, need the most complete listings available to assist us in this project. Considerable research has been done on Sask. tokens by Cec. Tannahull and others; however, the results of the work of these people is not readily available, if at all, to those interested. These people may consent to let us have and use the results of their hard work. However, they may not if they plan to publish in the near future. Therefore we proposed that in conjunction with this club project that we contact these people concerning this matter possibly offering to help them to get this information into print.

We may be able to get some financial support from such organizations as the Saskatchewan Diamond Jubilee and Canada Canada Centennial Corp. who have circulated a pamphlet asking for ideas for the Saskatchewan Diamond Jubilee in 1965.

Should the members of the club approve of this project we will probably need a continuing committee in charge of this project. I hope we will have some volunteers for this committee.

If approved by the club we ask that you support the project by donating material and or related information to the club. My donation will be the gold 1959 CNA Convention medal which I have bought tonight. Rene Gaudry has indicated that he will make and donate the display case.

I, therefore, make a motion on behalf of the Executive that we, as a club, begin to gather together a permanent Club Collection of Saskatchewan Numismatic material and related Historical information.

The meeting is now open for discussion concerning this project.
